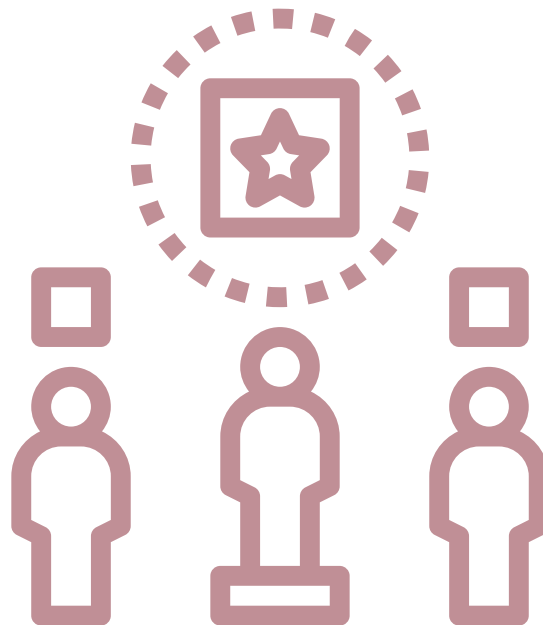

Internal




Internal competitions are beginner-level competitions that are held by the CSA and STAGs with local Winnipeg companies. Examples of internal case competitions include the UMAC Cup and the ASBAA Matrix Competition.



External

External competitions are national and international competitions. In order to qualify for these, students must take IDM 4050, the case class. The class is also the way that students are recruited for these competitions. Examples of external case competitions include TUBC (Thammasat Undergraduate Business Challenge), as well as SICC (Scotiabank International Case Competition).

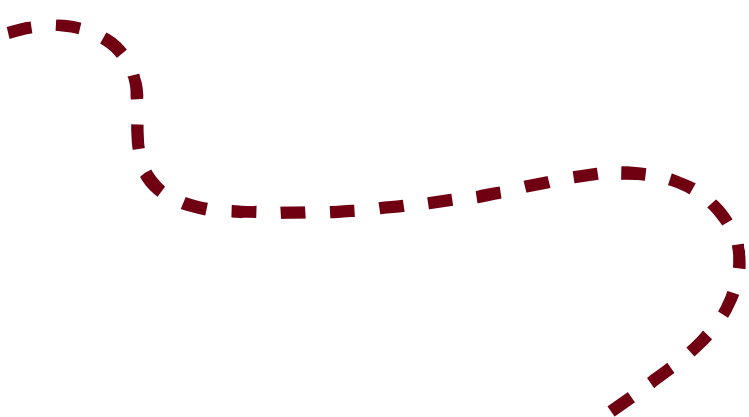

A student-run group supporting supply chain and logistics students through monthly meetings, industry insights, guest speakers, and community connections.



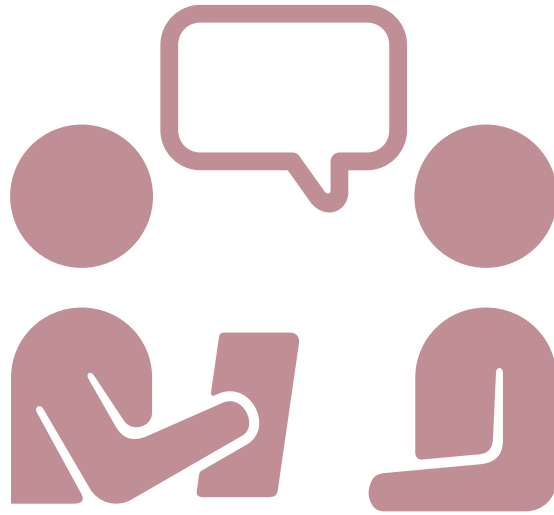
Tour de Commerce



Tour De Commerce is an excellent opportunity for students to build an understanding of Winnipeg's business scene through **several office tours** with employees present in the building, making it an excellent networking opportunity.



Mock Interviews



The mock interview program is an excellent way for students to showcase their skills to employers they could potentially intern or work for in the future.

Further, students will have **the opportunity to practice going through the interview process**, whether it is their first time going through an interview, or they simply need to shake off some rust.



Take a Student to Eat (TASTE)



Taste offers students a second-to-none **networking** opportunity, a one-on-one complimentary meal with a business professional. Students will have the **opportunity** to gain a strong **connection** and ask meaningful questions that may give you a better understanding of what your **future career** in business holds.



The CSA Mentorship Program



The CSA Mentorship Program connects a first- or second-year student with a third or fourth year student who holds similar interests, both personally and professionally. The mentor is responsible for **helping their mentee navigate their first couple years at Asper**. Further, all mentors and mentees will have the opportunity to **connect** through group activities and **networking** events.



University-Wide Opportunities



There are plenty of clubs and committees for Asper Students to join that welcome members from all faculties. Examples include the **Black Students Community, Rainbow Pride Center,** and **International Students Organization** (all located in the Helen Glass Building)

Commerce Students Association (CSA)



The **CSA** Represents the 2000+ students at the I.H Asper School of Business. The CSA is driven with purpose in acting as a facilitator between students, faculty, and our business community. The **CSA** is divided into 9 portfolios; Presidents, Internal, Finance, Corporate Relations, Professional Development, Community, Academics, Marketing, and Student Life that intertwine to keep Aspers plentiful events rolling year-to-year.



IMPORANT NOTES

CSA General Council recruiting takes place in the **spring**; however, plenty of opportunities still remain for students to get involved. Examples include the **First Year Committee (FYC)**, whose initiatives are intended to support the needs of first year students. There are also a variety of committees for events held by the CSA; including **NBSC, case competitions, Shinerama, 5 Days, and Commerce Cares**. Keep an eye out for recruitment posts throughout the year to get involved.
